

10.05.16 Australia - Hong Kong

Depart Sydney at 2.15pm on CX 100, arriving in Hong Kong at 9.35pm.

Depart Melbourne at 2.20pm on CX 104, arriving in Hong Kong at 9.50pm.

Upon arrival you are met and transferred to the Hotel Panorama by Rhombus Hotel, for a three night stay.

11.05.16 Hong Kong

(B)

Today there will be a half day Hong Kong Island Tour.

Our first stop is Man Mo Temple, which was built in 1847 and dedicated to the gods, Man (Literature) and Mo (Martial Arts). The temple is notable for its many fine, well-polished brass and pewter incense burners. Our next stop is Victoria Peak, overlooking the west of Hong Kong Island. It is the highest peak on the island and the most enduring tourist attraction in Hong Kong. We take a ride on the city's oldest transport, the 112 year old Peak Tram. In the early colonial rule, Victoria Peak was accessible only to Hong Kong's high society while the commoners could only visit the peak by permit from the colony's governor. Today Victoria Peak is a world renowned scenic spot. Our ride on the Peak Tram ascends to Victoria Peak, which is 1805 feet above sea level. On the peak you will experience the dazzling panorama of Hong Kong Island, the harbour, Kowloon Peninsula and the hills beyond.

We also visit Aberdeen, located on the southern tip of Hong Kong Island. It is the largest satellite town with a population of about 60,000. It was a pirates den two centuries ago and later turned into a simple fishing village. In recent years, with local high rise building developments, Aberdeen has modernised and now it has become a vibrant waterfront resort for people from metropolitan Hong Kong. Despite modernization, traditional fishing life still prevails. Hundreds of junks and sampans serve as floating homes for thousands of people. They crowd in the narrow harbour, dramatically juxtaposed against the modern high rise buildings that spread up the nearby hillsides. We take a sampan ride in the harbour to truly appreciate this fascinating place, followed by a visit to a prestigious jewellery factory, where you can find famous hand-crafted jewellery.

We also stop at Stanley Market. Stanley is a coastal village on the southern side of Hong Kong Island. It is a must see place for visitors to Hong Kong. Stanley used to be a small fishing village but in recent years, a series of restaurants and pubs have been established here. Now this village is bustling with throngs of people. Stanley Market is located up the road from the harbour and is the highlight of Stanley. Over the years it's become known for its bargains, which includes silk garments, sportswear, art, Chinese costumes, souvenirs, ornaments and a host of fantastic crafts. It is one of the famous open-air markets in Hong Kong. Strolling in this street and bargaining with the shrewd vendors is something most travellers find amusing to try.

Afterwards we are returned to the hotel. The remainder of the afternoon is at leisure.

12.05.16 Hong Kong

(B/D)

Today is at leisure to further explore fascinating Hong Kong. In the evening we transfer from the hotel to the pier for a cruise onboard the MV Rainbow Star to Lamma Island, which is located on the south west side of Hong Kong Island. Here we will enjoy a seafood dinner with award winning dishes at the Rainbow Seafood

Restaurant. Visitors from all over the world flock to the island to enjoy fresh seafood at a plethora of terraced restaurants raised on stilts above the bay. After dinner we cruise back to the mainland while enjoying the world class multimedia light and sound show 'A Symphony of Lights'. This show has been awarded the world's largest permanent light and sound show by Guinness World Records. After disembarking the ship we are transferred back to the hotel.

13.05.16 Hong Kong - Vancouver

(B) Breakfast at the hotel. This morning there is some free time for last minute Hong Kong shopping, before being transferred to the airport for our flight to Canada. Depart Hong Kong at 4.20pm on flight CX 838, arriving in Vancouver at 1.25pm the same day (you cross the International Date Line). Upon arrival we are transferred to our hotel. The remainder of the day is at leisure to do some independent exploring or recover from the flight. Our tour director is on hand this evening to answer any questions.

14.05.16 Vancouver

This morning we have an included city highlights tour showcasing Stanley Park, Chinatown, the harbour, beaches and more. The remainder of the day is free for you to further explore the city. Shoppers and browsers might like to take a water taxi to lively Granville Island with its outdoor markets, street musicians and waterfront cafés. Or you might like to visit historic Gastown with its steam-powered clock, antique shops, art galleries and street vendors.

15.05.16 Vancouver - Kelowna

This morning our journey begins in British Columbia's fertile valleys and continues through rich mountain forests to Lake Okanagan. Travel along the lake to the resort city of Kelowna, attractively set on the lakeshore and surrounded by orchards and vineyards. Sample the local wines on the included winery tour this afternoon.

16.05.16 Kelowna - Banff National Park

Motor north through the Okanagan Valley, famous for its peaches and vineyards. Then begin the climb up 1,335 metres (4,379 ft) high Rogers Pass, in Glacier National Park. Take a break at the pass, a perfect spot for photos of the impressively rugged mountains, glaciers and waterfalls. Enter Yoho National Park and scale Kicking Horse Pass at an altitude of 1,652 metres. This evening, reach Banff National Park, the gateway to the majestic Canadian Rockies.

17.05.16 Banff National Park

Banff is one of Canada's favourite year round resorts, with activities ranging from skiing in the winter to hiking, boating and fishing in the summer. With your free day, your tour director will suggest an optional helicopter ride over the Canadian Rockies.

18.05.16 Banff - Lake Louise - Columbia Ice field - Jasper National Park

A day of scenic grandeur. First we travel to Lake Louise, with its cold turquoise waters which are a perfect natural mirror reflecting the surrounding mountains and glaciers. A highlight on today's agenda is a stop at the Columbia Ice Field to experience the Ice Explorer, an all-terrain vehicle that travels on ice that is 365 metres (1,200 ft) thick. Precipitous gorges, snow capped summits and lakes of

exquisite blues and greens come into view as the motorcoach continues northward into Jasper National Park. Enjoy an orientation tour of the town of Jasper upon arrival.

19.05.16 Jasper National Park

Today you might like to join the optional excursion to Maligne Lake and Spirit Island, where you embark on a narrated cruise of the lake. The rest of the day is free to enjoy everything Jasper has to offer, from guided hikes and quaint shops to meandering wildlife.

20.05.16 Jasper National Park - Mount Robson - Sun Peaks

Leave Jasper and follow the Fraser River to the base of Mount Robson, the highest mountain in the Canadian Rockies, peaking at 3,953 metres (12,972 ft). Follow the Yellowhead Highway south along the North Thompson River, a route pioneered by fur trappers a century ago. Overnight at the mountain resort of Sun Peaks.

21.05.16 Sun Peaks - Lillooet - Whistler

Head south following the once treacherous Cariboo Wagon Trail, via Lillooet - 'Mile 0 of the Gold Rush Route'. Our motorcoach will follow the shores of Seton and Duffey Lakes with a late afternoon arrival in Whistler. Tonight, wander the many alpine trails or enjoy the shopping and great selection of restaurants and nightlife.

22.05.16 Whistler

Today is spent in the alpine resort of Whistler, nestled at the base of breathtaking Blackcomb Mountain. There is free time to explore many of the 2010 Winter Olympic sites, or join one of the many optional excursions.

23.05.16 Whistler - Ferry Crossing - Victoria

This morning we sail across the Strait of Georgia and through the spectacular Gulf Islands, an archipelago known for its Mediterranean-type climate. We have an afternoon arrival in Victoria. Sightseeing today includes Marine Drive, Bastion Square and the Thunderbird Park with its unusual collection of totem poles. Then visit world famous Butchart Gardens, one of Victoria's most celebrated sites and rated among the most beautiful gardens in the world. Once there, stroll through the colourful arrangements of the Sunken Garden, the Japanese and Italian Gardens, the English Rose Garden and the magnificent Ross Fountain.

24.05.16 Victoria

Today is at leisure to discover some of the attractions this splendid city has to offer. You might like to visit the Royal British Columbia Museum, have afternoon tea at the Empress Hotel, see an IMAX presentation at the National Geographic Theatre, go whale watching on the Strait of Juan de Fuca or enjoy fine shopping along Government Street.

25.05.16 Victoria - Vancouver (Embarkation)

(D) Early this morning, board the ferry for a scenic crossing to the mainland. Upon arrival we are transferred to Canada Place to board Holland America's MS Volendam for an unforgettable Inside Passage Cruise.

27.05.16 Juneau

(B/L/D)

Glacier Bay has more actively calving tidewater glaciers than anywhere else in the world. What's it like when a colossal chunk of ice splits off a glacier and crashes into the sea? The sound is like thunder. The impact shoots water hundreds of feet into the air. You hold your breath as you capture the moment photographically. Then you wait for it all to happen again.

30.05.16 Ketchikan
(B/L/D) Built out over the water and up weathered stairways, Ketchikan clings to the shores of Tongass Narrows and drapes the mountains with a hospitable air.

31.05.16 Cruising Inside Passage
(B/L/D) Return through the Inside Passage and cruise through more of this awe-inspiring scenery. Keep your cameras ready for spouting whales, soaring eagles and other wildlife. Tonight, enjoy a sumptuous dinner and onboard entertainment.

01.06.16 Vancouver - Hong Kong
(B) Disembark the ship this morning and transfer to Vancouver International Airport for our flights home. Depart Vancouver at 2.55pm on CX 837, arriving in Hong Kong at 7.15pm the following day (you re-cross the International Date Line).

02.06.16 Hong Kong - Sydney
Transfer to your next flight.
