Itinerary for Central Asia Tour

Included meals are indicated as B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner

14.05.20 Sydney – Seoul, South Korea

Depart Sydney at 10.20am on flight OZ 602, arriving in Seoul at 7.00pm.

Upon arrival we are transferred to our hotel for an overnight stay.

Accommodation: Best Western Incheon Hotel or similar

15.05.20 Seoul - Almaty, Kazakhstan

(B) Today is at leisure at our airport hotel. For those who wish there is an optional tour to the demilitarized zone of Korea. We travel to the Korean Demilitarized Zone to see the border that divides North and South Korea. Learn about the troubled history of the country, from the time of the Korean War to modern day. We will see Imjinak Park, Freedom Bridge, The 3rd Infiltration Tunnel, DMZ Theater/Exhibition Hall, Dora Observatory, Dorasan Train Station and Unification Village. Please note that this tour does not visit the Joint Security Area (JSA).

Lunch is at a local restaurant in Seoul before returning to the hotel and then heading for the airport for our flight to Kazakhstan.

The price for the **DMZ optional tour is \$150 per person**, including lunch.

All passengers depart Seoul at 6.10pm on flight OZ 577, arriving in Almaty at 10.05pm.

Upon arrival in Almaty we are met and transferred to our hotel.

Accommodation: Rakhat Palace Hotel or similar

16.05.20 Almaty, Kazakhstan – Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan

(B/L/D) In times gone by, Kazakhstan was one of the most important countries for Tzarist Russia and the Soviet Union. Almaty is the former capital of Kazakhstan and the current architectural richness of the city is due to the construction of its buildings during the Soviet era. The Soviet architecture has been successfully preserved in the city. We enjoy a sightseeing tour of the city, including Panfilov Park and its monument, dedicated to the 28 heroes of the Panfilovets, who died in 1941 while confronting the Nazi tanks near Moscow. Located in the centre of the park is the majestic sacred Zenkov Wooden Cathedral. We also visit the Central State Museum of Kazakhstan, which is one of the largest museums in Central Asia and includes a miniature replica of the country's chief archaeological treasure, the Golden Man, which is a warrior's costume made of 4000 gold pieces, many finely decorated with animal motifs.

After an included lunch at a local restaurant, we visit the Green Bazaar, which is one of the biggest market places in Almaty.

Later we are transferred to the airport for our one hour flight to Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

Upon arrival we are met and transferred to our hotel.

Dinner this evening is at the hotel.

Accommodation: Park Hotel or similar

17.05.20 Bishkek – Chon Kemin, Kyrgyzstan

(B/L/D) This morning we have an early breakfast and then commence a 2½ hour drive to Chon Kemin Gorge, a popular tourist destination renowned for its beautiful, unspoiled nature. On our way to Chon Kemin we will stop in the town of Tokmok to enjoy

buzkashi (ulak tartish) horse game. Afterwards we visit Burana Tower and the remains of the medieval city of Balasaghyn. We enjoy an included lunch with a local Kyrgyz family, then continue onto to Kemin. Upon arrival we check in to the guest house and proceed to Chon Kemin Gorge for a guided exploration of the beauty of the area, enjoying the wonderful landscapes, nature and some fresh air. For those who wish to have a horseback ride, Chon Kemin is a great place to experience this. Dinner will be served in the guesthouse restaurant.

Accommodation: Ashu Guest House or similar

18.05.20 Chon Kemin – Kochkor Village - Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan

(B/L/D) After breakfast we have a 2½ hour drive to Kochkor village, a previous Silk Road settlement where travellers would pitch their tents. Today it is known as a handicraft centre and one of the most authentic locations which has successfully preserved the ancient customs of the Kyrgyz nation. We will meet the local people of this beautiful countryside and learn about their ancient traditional craft skills, including the making of felt carpet ‘shyrdak’. The local people will also demonstrate the daily activities and we have a chance to enjoy a folklore show with traditional musical instruments. We then have a 3½ hour drive to return to our hotel in Bishkek. Dinner this evening is at the hotel.

Accommodation: Park Hotel or similar

19.05.20 Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan

(B/L/D) We have a relaxed start today, with our touring commencing at 10am. Our tour of Bishkek will include Ala Too Central Square, the Parliament building, the statue of Vladimir Lenin and the Central History Museum that portrays the life and history of the Kyrgyz people from their nomadic existence. Lunch is at a local restaurant. Our tour today concludes with a visit to the Fine Arts Museum. We will have an early dinner today to get some rest before tomorrow’s early morning flight.

Accommodation: Park Hotel or similar

20.05.20 Bishkek - Tashkent, Uzbekistan

(B/L/D) After an early breakfast we are transferred to the airport for our flight to Tashkent. Onboard the plane we will be handed two Uzbekistan Customs Declaration Forms. Please identically complete these forms on the flight (when exiting Customs, one will be kept by the authorities and the other must be retained by the passenger). Once through these formalities our luggage is loaded on the bus and our tour guide will treat us to some good coffee at JUM Café which is located just outside the airport. Tashkent is a green, wide-avenue city which was re-built in the 1960’s following the devastating earthquake of 1966. It was the fourth largest city in the Soviet Union. We spend the morning at the Applied Arts Museum. The wealthy Tsarist diplomat Alexander Poloztsev, a connoisseur of Oriental architecture and decorative patterns invited local master artisans to decorate his private mansion. It now houses a splendid collection of ikat fabrics, suzani, ceramics, metal work, carved wood, carpets and national garments. It is an excellent introduction to the applied arts we will see during the tour. Afterwards we visit Khazret Imam Complex, where we will be able to see one of the first editions of the Koran in the world. It was written in the 7th century by order of Uthman ben Affan.

After lunch we visit Kukeldash Madrasah, a significant architectural sight of the 16th century, followed by Chorsu Bazaar. We then transfer to our hotel for some free time. Dinner this evening is at the hotel.

Accommodation: Ichan Kala Hotel Tashkent or Lotte City Hotel Tashkent or similar

21.05.20 Tashkent – Khujand, Tajikistan

(B/L/D) Today we drive to the border to enter Tajikistan. Another Uzbekistan Customs Declaration form will be distributed by our tour guide, so please have this form ready prior to leaving the hotel. We will each require two complete forms, one which we have retained from our previous days entry and a newly completed form, both of which will be retained by authorities at the border crossing. Please note that an overnight bag is required for this visit, as our main luggage will be placed in secure storage within our Tashkent hotel. The drive to the border will take about 1½ hours. We will be assisted by our tour guide through Customs formalities, although please be prepared for a slow pedestrian crossing at the border, which includes a 1½ kilometre walk across ‘No Man’s Land’ between the two border controls. We will likely be required to carry our own luggage for this walk so remember to pack light. Time delays and inconvenience at border crossings are unfortunately unavoidable in Central Asia. Please think of this as a unique cultural experience of visiting Central Asia. Once we enter Tajikistan we will be met and travel approximately one hour to the city of Khujand to commence our sightseeing tour. We will first visit the Payshanba Bazaar, which is one of the most crowded bazaars in Tajikistan. We also visit Sheikh Muslihiddin Mosque and Mausoleum and Arbob Palace named after S. Urunhodlaev. We have an included lunch at a local restaurant. Our last stop for today is the Fortress of Temur Malik. This evening we enjoy an included dinner.
Accommodation: Feruz Hotel or similar

22.05.20 Khujand, Tajikistan

(B/L/D) This morning after breakfast visit the Monument to Lenin and Kayrakkum Hydro Power Station, which was built in 1968. After an included lunch in Khujand we return to our hotel with the remainder of the day at leisure. This evening we enjoy an included dinner.
Accommodation: Feruz Hotel or similar

23.05.20 Khujand - Tashkent, Uzbekistan

(B/L/D) This morning we have a one hour drive to the Tajik – Uzbek border. By this time our tour guide will once again have distributed to us two Uzbekistan Customs Declaration forms, please fill out both of these forms exactly the same as each other. When exiting Customs one will be kept by authorities and the other must be kept in a safe place by yourself (they must not be lost). After completing the border crossing formalities we will be transferred to Tashkent and have lunch at a local restaurant. Later we will visit the History Museum of Uzbekistan before being transferred to the hotel for check-in. There is some time at leisure to rest before an early dinner which will be organised outside of the hotel.
Accommodation: Ichan Kala Hotel Tashkent or Lotte City Hotel Tashkent or similar

24.05.20 Tashkent – Nukus – Khiva, Uzbekistan

(B/L/D) This morning we take an early breakfast at 4.30am and check out at 5.30am. We will be transferred to Tashkent Airport for a morning flight to Nukus. Upon arrival we will be transferred to the Karakalpak State Museum of Art named after I.V. Savitsky, an obsessive collector credited with saving tens of thousands of avant-garde artworks from Soviet authorities who forced artists toward Socialist Realism in the 1930’s. The

museum is in the parched hinterland of Uzbekistan. Nukus is home to one of the world's largest collections of Russian avant-garde art, the history and life of which is the subject of a recent American made documentary 'The Desert of Forbidden Art'. Until now the museum has been chiefly known to journalists and art lovers. After the morning visit we will have lunch at a local restaurant and then drive approximately 3 hours to Khiva. Upon arrival we check in at the hotel and have some time to rest until dinner. Dinner this evening will be at a local restaurant in the old city. Please note our accommodation for the next two nights is quite basic. Accommodation: Asia Khiva Hotel or similar

25.05.20 Khiva, Uzbekistan

(B/L/D) Once famous for its slave trade, fascinating history and architecture, Khiva is the most intact and the most remote of Central Asia's Silk Road cities. Life vibrates within the baked mud walls. The old town is only 26 hectares, however, it is packed with interesting buildings and wonderful craft studios. It is a place of extraordinarily carved wooden doors and magnificent tile work, a silk carpet workshop with unique silk carpets inspired by the designs of the tiles and doors, the workshop initiated by Christopher Aslan Alexander whose initial plan was to write a guidebook about Khiva, but he fell in love with this unbelievably fascinating place and decided to stay, eventually providing assistance to a local family of carpet weavers to revive the local carpet-weaving craft and establish a workshop in the centre of the old city. Today he is known as the author of a book called "A Carpet Ride to Khiva - Seven Years on the Silk Road". We will spend the day exploring Khiva and visiting the statue of Al Khwarizmy, the founder of Algebra, a 19th century unfinished minaret of Kalta Minar and a madrassah of Muhammad Amin Khan which today houses a hotel. Also visit Kuhna Ark Citadel, Muhammad Rakhim Khan madrassah and Juma masjeed (Friday mosque), the unusual beauty of which will impress anyone who visits this traditional place of worship. Lunch today is at a local restaurant. Afterwards we continue our sightseeing of Ican Kala (inner city) with a visit to the rest of the sites such as Islam Khoja complex, Tash Khauli Palace and the mausoleum of Pahlawan Mahmud. For dinner tonight we will enjoy a cooking and bread baking master class at a restaurant in the Old City.

Accommodation: Asia Khiva Hotel or similar

26.05.20 Khiva – Dashoghuz, Turkmenistan

(B/L/D) Today we have an early start for the border crossing between Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan. We travel approximately 1½ hours to the border and are guided through the pedestrian border crossing by the tour guide. On the Turkmenistan side, we will be met by our local guide and we will drive 90kms to Kohne Urganch. Lunch is at a local restaurant, followed by a visit to the Mausoleum of Fähraddeen Razi, built in the 12th – 13th centuries, a small, almost square erection crowned with the 12-sided marquee, related to the scientist Fähraddeen Razi. We then proceed to the blue-tiled tent designed Sultan Tekesh Mausoleum erected between 1172 and 1200, a mausoleum presenting an impressive semicubic structure covered with a high conic cupola. Turabeg Khanum Mausoleum is another mausoleum of the Princess Turabeg, daughter of the Golden Horde's Khan and the wife of the Governor of Gurganj (Kohne Urganch) Kutlugh Temur. We will then visit the 14th and 16th century mausoleums of Najm ad Deen Kubra and Sultan Ali. Our last historically important structure for today is Kutlug Temur Minaret from 1330, which is one of the tallest in Central Asia at 60 metres in height. Afterwards we travel on to Dashoghuz and check into the hotel. There is time for a short rest before an included dinner at the hotel.

Accommodation: Dashoghuz Hotel or similar

27.05.20 Dashoghuz – Darwaza – Ashgabat

(B/L/D) Today we set off on a long 600km drive to Ashgabat in a number of 4WD vehicles. En route we stop at Fortress Yzmykshir, the famous Darwaza Crater, otherwise known as the 'Gateway to Hell.' This natural gas sinkhole was discovered by Soviet geologists in 1971 while drilling for natural gas. The ground beneath the drilling rig collapsed, leaving a large hole with a diameter of 70 metres. To avoid poisonous gas discharge, it was decided that the best solution was to burn it off. Geologists had hoped that the fire would burn all the fuel in a matter of days, but the gas is still burning today. We will be provided with a lunch box as there are no other facilities to partake of a meal. After visiting the gas crater we continue the drive to Ashgabat, arriving in the evening.

Accommodation: Yyldyz Hotel or Sofitel Ashgabat or similar

28.05.20 Ashgabat

(B/L/D) Ashgabat is the capital city of Turkmenistan. Be amazed at this pristine white marble city. This morning after breakfast we enjoy a half-day visit to Tolkuchka. This bazaar is only open on Thursday, Saturday and Sunday and is the biggest and most colourful market of Ashgabat. It is one of the most impressive bazaars where we will feel the real essence of an oriental market, experiencing the interesting culture of Central Asian market traditions. We will then proceed to the Turkmen Carpet Museum and then visit a private horse stable with Ahalteke horses. Lunch today is included and dinner will be served in the hotel restaurant.

Accommodation: Yyldyz Hotel or Sofitel Ashgabat or similar

29.05.20 Ashgabat, Turkmenistan

(B/L/D) Our day of sightseeing will commence with the Turkmenbashy Ruhy Mosque, which is one of the biggest mosques in Central Asia. Our visit includes the family mausoleum of the first president of Turkmenistan.

Lunch will be at a local restaurant. We will then visit the Monument of Independence, the National Museum of Turkmenistan. This museum houses about 500,000 artefacts dedicated to the Bronze Age, Antiquity and middle age history of Turkmenistan.

Other sections of the museum include nature, ethnography, military and jewellery sections. We then drive 14kms to Old Nisa, which is the Parthian capital inhabited from the 3rd to the 19th century. Relics and findings have revealed a grandiose architectural complex consisting of ceremonial hall, treasure house and a few residences. Dinner will be at a local restaurant, which will be followed by a night city tour showing the illuminated monuments of Ashgabat.

Accommodation: Yyldyz Hotel or Sofitel Ashgabat or similar

30.05.20 Ashgabat - Mary, Turkmenistan

(B/L/D) Breakfast at the hotel before an early morning transfer to the airport for our short flight to Mary. Upon arrival we will begin our sightseeing in and around Mary, visiting ancient Merv, Sultan Sanjar mausoleum, Gavur Kala, Erk Kala and Kirk kiz Kala. Lunch will be at a local restaurant. We will then return to Mary and check into the hotel where we will have some leisure time to rest or explore. Dinner this evening will be in the hotel.

Accommodation: Mary Hotel or similar

31.05.20 Mary – Turkmenabat – Bukhara, Uzbekistan

(B/L/D) This morning after breakfast we will have a 260km drive to the Turkmen / Uzbek border via Turkmenabat. We will stop for lunch at a local restaurant in Turkmenabat and then continue our journey to the border. After crossing into Uzbekistan, we have a two hour drive to Bukhara. Upon arrival in Bukhara we check in to our hotel and then enjoy some time at leisure. You may choose to have a rest or be taken by the tour guide for a little walk around the Labi Havuz complex which is in the heart of old Bukhara, and have an opportunity to do some shopping. In the evening we will meet in the hotel lobby and be taken to a local restaurant for dinner.
Accommodation: Komil K Boutique Hotel or similar

01.06.20 Bukhara, Uzbekistan

(B/L/D) Today will be spent visiting architectural wonders such as the 9th century Ismael Samani Mausoleum, a perfect cube made of baked bricks in a basket weave pattern. Other sites include the Chashma Ayyub (Prophet Job's spring), Bolo Hauz Mosque and Ark Citadel. Lunch will be at a local restaurant, after which we will continue the tour with a visit to Miri Arab madrasa which is still active, and the Kalon Mosque and Minaret, which served as a beacon on the Silk Road. Visit covered bazaars of jewellers, hatters and money dealers and the Magoki Attari Mosque, which during the middle ages served as a mosque for Muslims and as a synagogue for Jews. The Labi Havuz complex will conclude our architectural visit of Bukhara. This evening enjoy an Uzbek traditional folklore music performance and a beautiful fashion parade of Uzbek textiles by a local designer while enjoying dinner within the old madrassah known as Nadyr Devan Beghy.
Accommodation: Komil K Boutique Hotel or similar

02.06.20 Bukhara - Samarkand

(B/L/D) After an early breakfast we will depart at 7am for Samarkand, the heart of Central Asia. On the way to Samarkand we will have a brief stop at Mr. Abdullah Narzullaev's wonderful home-based ceramics workshop in the town of Ghijduvan, one of the finest and most well-known ceramic studios of Central Asia. In fact, he is gaining worldwide recognition. Upon arrival in Samarkand we have lunch at a local restaurant and then visit two outstanding examples of 15th and 17th century architecture, the Guri Emir Mausoleum where Tamerlane himself, his mentor Mir Saeed Baraka, his sons and grandsons Ulugh Begh and Mohammed Sultan were buried. Followed by the ever-beautiful Registan Square which will conclude our sightseeing for today. We will make our way to the hotel for check in and later enjoy an included dinner.
Accommodation: Hotel Grand Samarkand Superior or similar

03.06.20 Samarkand

(B/L) Today we visit Konigil Samarkand paper factory where we will witness the ancient art of Samarkand papermaking and observe how the secrets and techniques have been revived. We will then visit the Samarkand Silk Carpet factory that uses only natural dyes (onion skins, madder, roots, walnut shells, pomegranate etc). Observe demonstrations of the entire process of silk dying, design selection and weaving at the loom. Exquisite and quite unusual embroidered pieces are on sale here along with ikats and silk velvet ikats. After an included lunch at a local restaurant we return to the hotel with the remainder of the day at leisure.

Accommodation: Hotel Grand Samarkand Superior or similar

04.06.20 Samarkand - Tashkent

(B/L/D) We will commence today's activities with a visit to Bibi Khanum Grand Mosque, Siyab Bazaar, Ulug Begh's Observatory and the Shakhi Zindi Necropolis. Lunch will be at a local restaurant followed by an afternoon transfer to Samarkand Railway Station to catch the fast speed train to Tashkent. This train reaches speeds of up to 250 KPH. The journey is 320 km and will take 2 hours and 10 mins. Please note that on occasions the fast train is not in operation. In this situation your train trip will be replaced with the regular train service.

We will arrive in Tashkent in the evening and upon arrival drive to a local restaurant for dinner. We will then drive to our hotel for an overnight stay.

Accommodation: Ichan Kala Hotel Tashkent or Lotte City Hotel or similar

05.06.20 Tashkent - Seoul

(B/D) After breakfast we will visit the Monument of Courage and Independence Square. Later we are returned to the hotel for some free time. This will give us a chance to either rest, pack or do something independently.

We have a late checkout from our hotel rooms and then a farewell dinner together at a lovely restaurant in Tashkent before being transferred to the airport for our flight to Seoul. Depart Tashkent at 10.20pm on flight OZ 574, arriving in Seoul at 8.55am the next morning (06.06.20).

06.06.20 Seoul

(L) Upon arrival in Seoul (Incheon Airport), we are met and taken on a tour of Seoul. We visit Gyeongbok Palace, which was originally established in 1395 as a royal palace of the Chosun Dynasty. However in the war in 1592, most of the buildings were destroyed by fire and it was not reconstructed for 273 years. It was rebuilt under Emperor Kojong in 1868. The dynasty had to move to Deoksu Palace and Gyeongbok Palace lost its place as the royal palace. Gyeongbok Palace still keeps its gorgeous looks of 500 years of Chosun Dynasty's history by having many stately buildings. Gyeongbok means shining happiness. We also visit the National Folk Museum, which is located inside Gyeongbok Palace and has over 4,000 historical artifacts that were used in the daily lives of ordinary Korean people. Then proceed to Cheonggyecheon Stream for a walking tour of this urban renewal project in downtown Seoul. Lunch is at a local restaurant. Afterwards we are transferred to the hotel for check in. The remainder of the day is at leisure.

Accommodation: Fraser Place Namdaemun or similar

07.06.20 Seoul – Sydney

(B/L) This morning we check out of the hotel visit Myeongdong, which is one of the primary shopping districts in Seoul, with many brand name shops and department stores lining the streets and alleys. We then visit Seoul Tower, which opened in 1980 and is 236 metres high, offering panoramic views of Seoul and the surrounding area. We enjoy an included lunch at a local restaurant and then visit Namdaemun Market, which is the largest traditional market in Korea. Afterwards we are transferred to the airport for our flight home.

Depart Seoul at 8.00pm on OZ 601, arriving in Sydney at 7.30am the next morning (08.06.20).

Note: This tour consists of several border crossings by both land and air, resulting in significant waiting times. This is an unavoidable inconvenience when travelling to this part of the world.

Central Asia can be a very unique and challenging destination, with long and often tiring travel days and arduous border crossings. Most passengers will not find this experience to be a holiday, but more an adventure which gives a rare insight into the way of life of the local people, their religions and traditions.

Also note that parts of this itinerary are subject to change due to possible flight changes or other unforeseen circumstances.

Tour Difficulty Ratings & Advice

To ensure that you select the right tour for you, Macleay Valley Travel has provided a clear set of tour difficulty and fitness recommendations for our tours. The ratings, from 1, being the easiest, to 5 the most strenuous, will give you a good idea of what is reasonably required for you to be able to participate on each tour. Most tours require a moderate to good level of fitness, however there are others that are quite challenging. For your enjoyment of the tour, and also the enjoyment of your fellow travellers, please consider whether or not the suggested difficulty level for the tour you are interested in is compatible with your health and fitness.

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Tour Difficulty Level 5

This tour rating typically involves a very active level of physical participation and requires a high level of physical activity to fully enjoy the touring experience. A tour level of this rating assumes you are able to ascend several flights of stairs with ease, get into a bathtub shower, being responsible for your own luggage at airports and hotels, boarding trains quickly with your luggage, walking distances of up to 2 kilometres at a time over possible uneven ground and/or cobblestone streets and on some instances being capable of doing this with your own luggage (land border crossings etc). Walking tours of considerable distances should be expected on tours with this rating. A level 5 tour rating is usually significantly more strenuous than the other ratings and can include rough terrain and isolated areas. Unfortunately this tour rating is not suitable for individuals who cannot walk unaided.

Passports - All travellers require a current passport with at least 6 months left on it at the end of the tour. Non-Australian passport holders require a re-entry visa for Australia. Visas are required for all Australian passport holders to Tajikistan and Turkmenistan. For Turkmenistan, visas can be obtained upon arrival into the country, however Turkmenistan requires a letter of invitation and pre-approval before departing on the tour. Macleay Valley Travel will assist in obtaining this. For Tajikistan an Evisa is required to be obtained before departing on the tour at <https://www.evisa.tj> at a current cost of USD \$50. The current cost for the Turkmenistan visa is USD \$73. A visa is not required for Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan. Uzbekistan is currently trialling a visa free period for Australian passport holders. Please note that the costs and procedures for the above mentioned visas are subject to change. We have found these prices can fluctuate.

Basic Tour Price and Taxes - Air taxes and fuel levies are included in the basic tour price if the tour is paid in full on or before the due date on the final invoice. Macleay Valley Travel reserves the right to charge for any increase in air taxes and fuel levies if the tour is not paid in full by the due date.
