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

During the day the compact twin berth sleeper cabins offer a comfortable three seater lounge, converting to an upper and lower sleeping berth at night. Your journey will be made even more comfortable with service from the hospitality attendant, including fresh sheets, bath towels, pillows, doonas and complimentary toiletries. Twin berth sleeper cabins have private ensuite facilities with a hide-away compact toilet, wash basin and shower. Gold service features include:

Day 1 – Sydney and Blue Mountains

As the train continues to navigate the heights of the ranges, it's time to wet your appetite with one of the Indian Pacific's signature dining experiences. Perhaps sample the grilled swordfish or the tender lamb shoulder slow-cooked in Kangaroo Island honey and black vinegar? Just make sure you leave room for your dessert which could be the apple and wild rosella flower strudel or a regional cheese plate comprising Hunter Belle blue, Alexandrina cheddar and Margaret River brie. In no time, you'll notice a dramatic change in landscape as the outback makes way for the green and golden fields of South Australia's food bowl. Your choice for the afternoon and evening is the picturesque city of Adelaide or the historic Barossa Valley. For guests choosing Adelaide, a leisurely walking tour allows you to discover hidden secrets along the cultural boulevard of North Terrace and stroll through the Botanic Gardens to your dinner venue for the evening, the National Wine Centre. Here, you will indulge in a specially-tailored food and wine experience in this stunning venue before returning to the train. Alternatively, explore the Barossa Valley's boutique wineries and learn about the wine making process. You will then be transferred back to Adelaide, ready to continue your journey to Perth. After socialising in the Outback Explorer Lounge, head back to your room where you'll find your bed turned down and a nightcap waiting on the bedside table. For your next epic 24 hours, you'll embark on the longest leg of the journey across the Nullarbor Plain.

- 15.10.17** Arrive Port Kelang (Kuala Lumpur), Malaysia at 10am, departing at 8pm.
- 16.10.17** Arrive Penang, Malaysia at 9am, departing at 11pm.
- 17.10.17** Arrive Langkawi, Malaysia at 8am, departing at 6pm.
- 18.10.17** Arrive Phuket, Thailand at 7am, departing at 6pm.
- 19.10.17** At sea.
- 20.10.17** Arrive Singapore at 7am. After disembarking the cruise ship you are transferred to the Hotel Jen Tanglin by Shangri-La in Singapore (or similar) for a two night stay with breakfast daily. The remainder of the day is at leisure.
- 21.10.17** Today is at leisure in Singapore.
- 22.10.17** This morning is at leisure in Singapore. You check out of your hotel room at the standard check out time. Later you are transferred to the airport for your flights home.
Brisbane passengers depart Singapore at 8.50pm on QF 52, arriving in Brisbane at 6.15am the next morning (23.10.17).
Melbourne passengers depart Singapore at 11.50pm on QF 38, arriving in Melbourne at 10.30am the next morning (23.10.17).
Sydney passengers depart Singapore at 11.55pm on QF 6, arriving in Sydney at 10.50am the next morning (23.10.17).

Deposits and Payments - A non-refundable deposit of \$1,600 per person is payable within 3 days of booking. This deposit is not refundable should you later cancel. The balance is payable in full 12 weeks prior to departure.

Refunds and Cancellations - Cancellations after final payment will result in a refund limited to whatever we can recoup from the airline.

Insurance - Adequate travel insurance is essential. We can arrange this for you if desired. Macleay Valley Travel offers Suresave Travel Insurance. Please note that we can only process your travel insurance when we have received full payment for the insurance and the signed Suresave Travel Insurance application form, located on the last page of the Suresave Travel Insurance information booklet. Until this time the travel insurance cannot be processed and will not be valid. Macleay Valley Travel will bear no responsibility for any consequences that may occur as a result of an incomplete insurance application.

Passports - All travellers require a current passport with at least 6 months left on it at the end of the tour. Non-Australian passport holders require a re-entry visa for Australia. A visa is required for Indonesia and can be obtained upon arrival at a cost of \$35 USD per person. Please note that this price is subject to change.

Basic Tour Price and Taxes - Air taxes and fuel levies are included in the basic tour price if the tour is paid in full on or before the due date on the final invoice. Macleay Valley Travel reserves the right to charge for any increase in air taxes and fuel levies if the tour is not paid in full by the due date.

Not Included in the Cost - All items of a personal nature such as telephone calls, drinks, excess baggage, tips, meals, (except those specified in the itinerary), travel insurance etc. and airport transfers. Similarly, credit card payments can only be accepted if 2% is added to the price to help defray the heavy merchant fees charged to us by the credit card companies. There is a 3% surcharge for Diners Club.
