03.08.24 Australia – Dubai

Depart Brisbane at 9.00pm on EK 435, arriving in Dubai at 5.10am the next morning.
Depart Sydney at 9.10pm on EK 413, arriving in Dubai at 5.40am the next morning.
Depart Melbourne at 9.15pm on EK 407, arriving in Dubai at 5.15am the next morning.

04.08.24 Dubai

We are transferred to our hotel for a two night stay. We will have early check-in to our hotel rooms to recover from the overnight flight. The remainder of the day is at leisure to relax or do some independent exploring.
Accommodation: Occidental Al Jaddaf or similar

05.08.24 Dubai

(B)

After an included breakfast, we commence a half day city tour of modern Dubai. First we drive to Dubai Palm Jumeirah area and have a photo-stop of Blue Water Island. We then have an included one way monorail ride to the Palm Jumeirah. We continue for photo-stops at the iconic Burj Al Arab Hotel, The Point at the Palm and Dubai of the Future Museum. Afterwards we visit a showroom to see Lewan carpet art. Following this we are returned to the hotel with the remainder of the afternoon at leisure.
For those who wish there is an optional Dubai Desert Safari with Arabian BBQ dinner. The estimated price is \$50 USD per person, and can be paid to the guide on the day. Please note this activity can be quite rough and is not suitable for everyone.

06.08.24 Dubai – Bucharest, Romania

(B)

This morning we transfer to the airport for our flight to Romania.
Depart Dubai at 10.20am on EK 2244, arriving in Bucharest at 2.45pm (this flight is operated by Fly Dubai).
Upon arrival we are transferred to the hotel for a three night stay.
Accommodation: Hotel Europa Royale or similar

07.08.24 Bucharest

(B)

After breakfast we enjoy a full day city tour of Bucharest, viewing the main sites of the city including the Palace of the Parliament and the Old Town. Our tour includes an inside visit to Primaverii Palace, the former private residence of the late Dictator Nicolae Ceausescu, one of the most famous figures in Romania's history. He was the last dictator of communist Romania and the country's president between 1965 and 1989. We also have an inside visit to Romanian Peasant Museum, where we can learn about the evolution of folk art. The museum has the richest collection of traditional objects in Romania, where we can admire ceramic exhibitions, fabrics, folk costume, sculpted objects, furniture and icons. The collection consists of 100,000 objects.
At the conclusion of the tour we are returned to the hotel.

- 08.08.24 (B) Bucharest – Transylvania - Bucharest**
Today we enjoy a full day tour to Transylvania. After a 3½ hour drive we reach our first stop, Bran Castle, which is commonly known as ‘Dracula’s Castle’. Our tour includes entrance into the castle. Next we travel to the historical town of Brasov and have some free time for lunch at our own expense. We continue to Prejmer and visit the Fortified Church. This very well preserved church is one of the largest and most dramatic churches in Romania.
At the conclusion of the visit we return to our hotel in Bucharest.

- 09.08.24 (B/D) Bucharest – Oltenita**
This morning is at leisure. We check out of our hotels at the usual check-out time. After this our bags can be stored at the hotel while we have free time to further explore the city. Later this afternoon we depart the hotel for a 65km drive to the cruise port in Oltenita. Boarding commences at 6pm.
The MS L’Europe was built in 2006 and renovated in 2016. The ship is 110 metres long and can carry 180 passengers. It is a friendly and comfortable ship with facilities that include a restaurant, lounge bar, dance floor and large sundeck. All cabins offer panoramic views. The cabins are either twin bed or double bed configuration, and are equipped with a television, safe, independent air-conditioning, 220V electricity supply and a bathroom with a shower and toilet.
This evening we will meet the crew and enjoy a welcome cocktail and dinner.

- 10.08.24 (B/L/D) Oltenita – Fetesti – Tulcea**
We spend the day enjoying the ship’s facilities as we cruise towards the Danube Delta, which feeds into the Black Sea. Lunch and dinner today are included onboard.
Tonight we enjoy an evening of traditional folklore onboard.
Accommodation: Onboard
- 11.08.24 (B/L/D) Tulcea & the Danube Delta**
This morning we have an included tour of the Danube Delta. We’ll begin with a 500 metre walk and then board a tourist pleasure boat to begin our visit of the Danube Delta. We’ll board small local boats with a capacity of 50 passengers to discover the flora and fauna of this biosphere in the company of our guides. The site is one of 300 international biosphere reserves designated by UNESCO to try to measure the impact of man on the environment. The human presence on the north and south banks of the delta has been in evidence since Neolithic times, when the delta was still only a gulf in the Black Sea. The Danube Delta is home to more than 1200 different varieties of plants, 300 species of birds and 45 different freshwater fish varieties in its many lakes and marshes. During our visit, we may be lucky enough to catch a glimpse of some white pelicans, dwarf cormorants, glossy ibis or other species. We’ll return to our ship on foot and then cruise to Oltenita, with our ship cruising through the night.
Accommodation: Onboard
- 12.08.24 (B/L/D) Oltenita – Giurgiu – Excursion to Bucharest – Ruse, Bulgaria**
Today we enjoy a guided tour of Bucharest, which offers a striking combination of architectural styles including orthodox churches, Empire-style manor houses and Communist-inspired architecture. According to legend, the city was founded by a

shepherd called Bucur, which means 'joy' in Romanian. Bucharest has suffered greatly from its communist past, but has somewhat modernised since the year 2000, due to significant economic growth.

We'll start our visit with a panoramic tour of the city giving an overview of the various monuments of the capital. We'll then head to a restaurant for a typical Romanian lunch with traditional music and folklore dancing to entertain us. After lunch, we'll visit Bucharest's Eco-museum, a genuine village in the city where we'll learn about the habitats of the different regions of Romania and their handicrafts. We'll conclude our visit with a photo stop at the Palace of Parliament, a gigantic neo-classical style marble construction designed by Ceausescu, before visiting the Orthodox Church.

Afterwards we return to our ship and cruise to Ruse, one of the biggest ports in Bulgaria. This evening enjoy traditional entertainment onboard the ship.

13.08.24 Ruse

(B/L/D)

This morning we depart the ship by coach to visit the rock monastery of St Dimitar Basarabovski. The monastery is the only functional men's rock monastery in Bulgaria, a site filled with history and still a place of worship. We then have a city tour of Ruse, with its impressive broad avenues, large squares and wonderful buildings which pay tribute to the architecture of the national Renaissance. Ruse was founded by the Romans under the orders of Emperor Augustus. We'll see the Dohodno Zdanie, the Roman Catholic St Paul of the Cross Cathedral and the Monument of Liberty. Following this we have some free time before returning to the ship by coach.

This afternoon we cruise through two countries, with Romania on the left bank and Bulgaria on the right bank. Our ship will continue to cruise through the night.

14.08.24 The Iron Gates

(B/L/D)

The day will be spent cruising on the Danube, sailing through Romania, Bulgaria and Serbia. Our ship will pass through the Iron Gates, the gorge on the Danube between the Carpathians and the Balkans. On the Serbian bank of the river, we'll catch a glimpse of the Tabula Traiana, a marble plaque honouring the Roman Road that once linked Rome to the province of Dacia.

15.08.24 Belgrade – Novi Sad, Serbia

(B/L/D)

This morning we arrive in Belgrade, and have a guided tour of the Serbian capital. Belgrade is one of the oldest cities in Europe, with a history stretching back some 7,000 years. The city is located at the confluence of the Sava and the Danube rivers, close to the Morava Corridor, which links the countries of the Danube to the Aegean Sea. We begin our visit with a panoramic city tour, during which we will have the opportunity to see Belgrade's National Theatre and National Museum, the Royal Palace, which currently houses the City Assembly of Belgrade, the Ancient Royal Palace and more. We'll stop to visit the Orthodox Temple of St Sava. The construction of this church began in 1939 and is still a work in progress following the Second World War and Tito's dictatorship. We have some free time in the city centre, before transferring to Kalemegdan Park, the largest and most beautiful park in the city. This afternoon we have an excursion to visit Krusedol Monastery, located in the mountainous region of Fruska Gora. Be delighted by the magnificent paintings from the 18th century that adorn this beautiful 16th century monastery.

We then set off by coach to visit the town of Novi Sad, capital of the autonomous region of Vojvodina and the second largest town in Serbia. The town has a long and troubled history, being under the rule of the Celts, Romans, Franks, Barbarians and Turks until it became part of the Habsburg Empire. The history of the town was further troubled during the 20th century when after the First World War, the Balkan territories were in turn united and separated under different names, until in 2006 when the town finally became part of an independent Serbia.

We'll visit the city centre on foot and the Austro-Hungarian old town, with its baroque buildings which were established around the ancient fortifications. We'll get the chance to visit the Episcopal Church as well as an orthodox church before we continue up the main street to Freedom Square where we'll find the town hall, dating from 1895. The coach will be waiting for us near Freedom Square to finish the visit with a panoramic tour up the main boulevards.

Afterwards we return to our ship in Novi Sad and start cruising in the direction of the Mohacs.

Accommodation: Onboard

16.08.24 Mohacs – Kalocsa, Hungary

(B/L/D)

Today we arrive in Mohacs. In the afternoon we have an included excursion to the Puszta, also known as the Great Plain of Hungary. We depart by coach in the company of our host in the direction of Kiskunsag Park, at the heart of the Puszta. The Puszta is a large, flat grassland that was regarded as the 'Wild West of Hungary' in the 19th century with cowboys watching over colossal cattle herds grazing on pasture. The Puszta has been listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO since 1999. Riding aboard a charabanc (traditional horse-drawn carriage with wooden benches) we'll be amazed by the wonderful landscapes and unusual fauna of the Puszta. In a small part of the Hungarian Steppe, we'll get a chance to observe Racka sheep with their spiral-shaped horns, Mangalica pigs with their curly coats and Hungarian Grey cattle with their long, curved horns, as well as rare species of birds. In the course of our visit, we'll also get the chance to attend a traditional equestrian show while tasting "palinka" and some "pogacsa" (small savoury buns) as well as mineral water, sheltered from the sun under a thatched roof. The csikós, the mounted horse-herdsmen of Hungary dressed in traditional blue attire, will invite us to take part in their games of skill and ability. Afterwards we return by coach to our ship in Kalocsa and then cruise through the night to Budapest. This evening we enjoy a Hungarian feast onboard.

Accommodation: Onboard

17.08.24 Budapest, Hungary

(B/L/D)

This morning we have an included panoramic tour of Budapest, the Pearl of the Danube. First we will head for the hills of Buda by crossing the Elizabeth Bridge and we will go up to the Castle Quarter, from where we'll enjoy a fantastic panoramic view of the city. We will walk round the Castle Quarter and on to the Fisherman's Bastion, built in neo-Roman style in 1902. Behind the Bastion, we will find Matthias Church, the oldest church in the city founded in 1015 by Saint Stephen, which notably was the venue for the coronation of Emperor Franz Joseph and his wife "Sissi". Our coach will take us down to the plains of Pest. There, we will visit Heroes' Square whose central monument depicting Prince Arpad and the chieftains of seven Magyar tribes was built for the millennium of Hungary. We will pass by the famous Szechenyi thermal baths, the zoo, Vajdahunyad Castle and more. We will walk through the famous Andrassy Avenue and pass by St. Stephen's Basilica whose construction began in 1851 and was not completed until 1905. We will walk along the

river and see the famous Parliament building overlooking the Danube with its white silhouette in the Byzantine and neo-Gothic styles. Afterwards we return to the ship, with the remainder of the afternoon at leisure. Our ship sails to Bratislava, cruising through the night.

Accommodation: Onboard

18.08.24 Bratislava, Slovakia

(B/L/D)

This morning we arrive in Bratislava, Slovakia. Before becoming the capital of independent Slovakia in 1993, Bratislava was the capital of Hungary from 1536 to 1784 under its former name Presburg. It then belonged to Czechoslovakia before becoming the capital of the Slovak Socialist Republic as part of Czechoslovakia between 1969 and 1992.

In the afternoon we will commence a panoramic tour of the city, which will take us to Bratislava Castle (outside visit), which dates from 1811, after the previous castle burned down. From here we will enjoy a breathtaking view over the Danube and the city below. The main historical monuments are located in the Old Town and the coach will drop us off at the entrance to the Old Town to continue our visit on foot. We will enter the city through Michael's Gate, which is the only gate still surviving from the Middle-Ages. Then we will head for the central square, surrounded by elegant buildings and dominated by the old Bratislava Town Hall. The tour continues with the Primate's Palace (outside visit) completed in 1781 for Archbishop Jozef Bathyány. As we stroll through the streets, we may come across some of the amusing statues that are dotted around the capital. After the tour there is some free time before returning to the ship on foot or by coach, depending on sailing times. Later we set sail for Vienna.

Accommodation: Onboard

19.08.24 Vienna, Austria

(B/L/D)

In the morning we will commence our included tour of Vienna by taking the famous Ring to reach Schoenbrunn Palace. The "Ring" was one of the personal projects of Emperor Franz Joseph. In 1857, he decided to take down the ramparts that enclosed the city centre and had this boulevard built lined with fine buildings. Along the Ring we can admire this architectural showcase of the old Austro-Hungarian monarchy, including the State Opera, the Hofburg Palace, the Natural History Museum, the City Hall, the Burgtheater and more.

When we arrive at Schoenbrunn Palace, we will be guided through the numerous rooms of the Hapsburgs' summer residence, which bear witness to the splendour of the court at the time of Maria Theresa. We will also have some time to wander through the palace gardens.

Afterwards we are transferred to the city centre to enjoy some free time in the area around St Stephen's Cathedral. We will then return to the coach and transfer back to the ship via the Ring. This evening we have an included dinner onboard the ship reminisce about our time in Eastern Europe.

Accommodation: Onboard

20.08.24 Vienna – Dubai

(B)

This morning we have breakfast onboard and then disembark the ship at 9am. We are transferred to the airport for our flights home. Please note that we will have a lengthy wait at the airport before our flight departs.

Depart Vienna at 3.30pm on EK 128, arriving in Dubai at 11.05pm.

21.08.24 Dubai – Australia

Sydney passengers depart Dubai at 2.15am on EK 414, arriving in Sydney at 10.05pm.
Brisbane passengers depart Dubai at 2.30am on EK 430, arriving in Brisbane at 10.20pm.

Melbourne passengers depart Dubai at 2.40am on EK 408, arriving in Melbourne at 9.50pm.

Note: The itinerary on board the cruise ship is to be used as a guide only, and is subject to change pending operational and weather conditions.



INFORMATION ABOUT THE CRUISE

Breakfast is a self-serve buffet in the onboard restaurant, which may include pastries, coffee, tea, juice, breads, jams, a variety of sausages and cold cuts, eggs, fresh fruit and yoghurt.

Lunch and dinner will be 3 course sit down meals prepared by the onboard chefs and served at set times and in a single seating for all passengers. The tables usually seat six persons. The meals often include local specialities, made from fresh ingredients. Both lunch and dinner meals are paired with excellent complimentary wines.

Free beverages are provided with every meal, including mineral water, fruit juice, tea, coffee, house wine and beer. Champagne, premium wines and spirits are available at an additional charge.

The cabins on the cruise have individual controls for air conditioning and heat, so you can adjust your room to meet your needs. Each cabin is equipped with a television, 220V electricity and a safe. For your personal comfort all cabins are equipped with a shower, toilet and basin, and are provided with towels, but not washcloths. There are no laundry or ironing facilities onboard.

Entertainment on board consists of various games, dinner-dances and other lively evenings in the lounge.

The primary language onboard the ship is French, however the majority of the staff and tour guides are fluent in English. Notices and announcements are in French and English.

The primary currency onboard is the Euro. Visa, MasterCard and American Express are also accepted. There are no currency exchange facilities onboard.

Electricity onboard is 220V. You will need to bring a standard two-pin 'European' adaptor for your electrical items.

The dress code is typically smart casual attire. Bring a variety of clothing for the environments expected on the cruise, including a rain coat and/or small umbrella. We advise you to bring clothes which do not wrinkle too much because there are no ironing facilities on board. Regarding dinners, cocktails and galas, it is advisable to dress up a little more without the need, for gentlemen, necessarily to wear a jacket and tie.

Tipping – It is ship policy that any tips received will be shared equally among all crew members. An acceptable tipping guideline is 5 – 10 Euros per person, per day, with the understanding that tipping is entirely at your discretion. To leave a tip, please use the envelope found in your cabin on your last evening onboard.

Free Wi-Fi internet is available in the lounge area of the ship.

There is no doctor or nurse available on the ship.

Conditions for Macleay Valley Travel's European Waterways Tour

Deposits and Payments - A non-refundable deposit of \$600 per person is payable within 7 days of booking. This deposit is not refundable should you later cancel. The balance is payable in full 14 weeks prior to departure. Macleay Valley Travel has to adhere to strict payment deadlines and your booking on the tour may be cancelled if final payment is not received by the due date, with no refund applicable.

Refunds and Cancellations - Cancellations after final payment will result in a refund limited to whatever we can recoup from the airline. Any refund for a cancelled booking will not be paid until the airline(s) have provided said refund.
