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

Itinerary for Israel & Jordan Tour – February 2018

Included meals are indicated as B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner

18.02.18 Australia - Dubai

Depart Brisbane at 8.45pm on EK 435, arriving in Dubai at 5.20am the next morning (19.02.18).

Depart Sydney at 9.45pm on EK 413, arriving in Dubai at 5.15am the next morning (19.02.18).

Depart Perth at 10.20pm on EK 421, arriving in Dubai at 5.25am the next morning (19.02.18).

Depart Melbourne at 10.30pm on EK 407, arriving in Dubai at 5.40am the next morning (19.02.18).

19.02.18 Dubai – Amman, Jordan

(D)

All passengers depart Dubai at 8.00am on EK 901, arriving in Amman, Jordan at 9.40am. Welcome to Jordan. We are met at the airport and then commence a city tour of Amman, the capital of the Hashemite Kingdom. Often referred to as the ‘White City’ because of the white stone used to build houses. Amman offers a contrast between oriental and cosmopolitan. The tour will take us to the museums, the citadel, the amphitheatre, the souks and the modern part of town. Afterwards we are transferred to our hotel for an overnight stay. Tonight enjoy an included dinner. Accommodation: Geneva Hotel or similar

20.02.18 Amman – Petra

(B/D)

This morning we depart our hotel for Petra. En route we visit ‘Bethany beyond the Jordan’. This area opposite Jericho has been identified for nearly two millennia as the area where Jesus was baptized. We then continue to Mount Nebo, considered to be the burial site of Moses, overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. Here Franciscans have built a structure that protects a 4th and 6th century Byzantine church. After a short drive we will arrive in the mosaic city of Madaba and visit Saint George’s Church. The church floor houses the oldest map of the Holy Land, dating back to 565 A.D. This original ancient mosaic map refers to approximately 150 biblical sites that flourished during the Byzantine period, with Jerusalem at its centre. Tonight enjoy an included dinner.

Accommodation: Petra Guest House or similar

21.02.18 Petra

(B/D)

Today we depart on a full day tour of Petra. Once the ancient Nabatean capital, this city has a lot to tell. Our tour commences at the visitor centre, where each person is assigned a Bedouin guided horse for the journey to the entrance of the lost city. After passing some tombs which are located outside of the city, we pass through the Siq, an immense crack in the Nubian sandstone. This crack is a winding, 1km long fissure between overhanging cliffs that seem to meet more than 300 feet overhead. Near the end of the passage the SIQ makes one last turn and out of the gloom in towering brightness appears Petra’s most impressive monument, el Khazneh ‘The Treasury’. This is one of the most elegant remains of antiquity, carved out of the solid rock from the side of the mountain, nearly 140 feet high and 90 feet wide. Beyond el Khazneh, we are surrounded on both sides by hundreds of Petra’s carved

and built structures, soaring temples, elaborate royal tombs, a carved Roman theatre, large and small houses, burial chambers and much more.

This evening we enjoy a wonderful show at el Khazneh ‘The Treasury’. We sit on traditional mats and listen to Bedouin music played on their special instruments while sipping sweet and flavoured tea.

22.02.18 Petra – Eilat, Israel

(B/D)

This morning we transfer to the magical desert of Wadi Rum, home of ‘Lawrence of Arabia’. Upon arrival we will take one of the jeeps owned by the local Bedouins for a trip to many sites of the moon-like landscaped desert. We will start from the visitor centre and drive approximately ten minutes to get to Wadi Rum village. We then visit Lawrence Spring, which was named after T.E. Lawrence of ‘Lawrence of Arabia’ fame, who fought in the Arab revolt against the Ottoman Empire.

We continue to Khazali Canyon, which is an iconic feature of Wadi Rum. We have a 20 minute walk to enable us to see many Nabatean inscriptions and drawings. Our final stop is the sand dunes, before heading back to the visitor centre, passing by Wadi Rum village.

Following this we cross the land border into Israel, with our Jordanian guide assisting with the border formalities.

On the Israeli side, we will be met by our guide and transferred to our hotel in Eilat for a two night stay. Dinner this evening is at our hotel.

Accommodation: Prima Music Eilat or similar

23.02.18 Eilat

(B/D)

Today we have a panoramic tour of Eilat, including a visit to the underwater observatory. Eilat is famous for its world class coral reefs with an abundant variety of fish species. The remainder of the day is at leisure. Dinner this evening is at our hotel.

Accommodation: Prima Music Eilat or similar

24.02.18 Eilat – Dead Sea

(B/D)

After breakfast this morning, we check out of the hotel and travel on the Arava Desert Road to Timna, the site of the world’s first copper mine. Thousands of ancient mining shafts can be seen throughout the park, as well as the remains of smelting furnaces dating back to ancient Imperial Egypt. We continue driving north to the Dead Sea, where we check into our hotel for an overnight stay.

Later we will have an opportunity to float in the unsinkable Dead Sea and use the hotels spa facilities. Dinner this evening is at the hotel.

Accommodation: Prima Oasis Dead Sea or similar

25.02.18 Dead Sea – Tiberias

(B/D)

This morning we drive to Masada and ascend Herod’s mountain fortress by cable-car for a guided visit through the last stronghold of the Jewish zealots against the Romans following the destruction of Jerusalem. We visit the Byzantine Monastic Church located atop of the cliffs. Walk through the Nachal David desert oasis and waterfall in the Ein Gedi Nature Reserve with Bible in hand, and read the psalms attributed to King David in the place where they may have been written. We continue north and explore the caves of Qumran, the site of a Jewish community in

the days of the Second Temple where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Driving along the Jordan valley passing Jericho, we arrive in Tiberias, our home for the next three nights. This evening enjoy an included dinner.
Accommodation: Prima Galil Tiberias or similar

26.02.18 Tiberias – Golan Heights – Caesarea Philippi - Tiberias

(B/D)

We start the day with a visit to the Talmudic synagogue at Karzrin. We drive to the Golan Heights and ascend to Mount Bental, overlooking Syria, to gain a better understanding of the events of Israel's wars of 1967 and 1973 and the issues confronting Israel today. Here we will also have a birds eye view of Israel's expansive Hula Valley below. We continue north for a visit to Caesarea Philippi / Baniyas and have a short hike at Tel Dan (weather permitting). View snowy peaks of Mount Hermon. This evening enjoy an included dinner.
Accommodation: Prima Galil Tiberias or similar

27.02.18 Tiberias – Sea of Galilee – Safed - Tiberias

(B/D)

This morning we enjoy a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. We then proceed to Ginosar to visit an ancient boat dated from the time of Jesus. Next we travel to Capernaum on the Sea of Galilee for a visit to the ruins of the ancient synagogue. We continue to Tabgha, which is the miraculous site of the multiplication of loaves and fish. Here we view a magnificent mosaic. Next we have some time to enjoy the serenity of the Mount of Beatitudes, site of the "Sermon on the Mount".
This afternoon we drive to Safed to see what has been the centre of Jewish mysticism for hundreds of years. We visit an artist colony and many unique synagogues and have some time to stroll along the art galleries and shops. This evening enjoy an included dinner.
Accommodation: Prima Galil Tiberias or similar

28.02.18 Tiberias – Nazareth – Tel Aviv

(B/L/D)

After breakfast we travel to Nazareth for a view of the boyhood home of Jesus and Annunciation Church. We continue to Haifa for a breathtaking view of the bay and the beautiful Bahai Gardens. We ascend Mount Carmel for a magnificent view of the Jezreel Valley and learn about Elijah the Prophet. We enjoy a traditional Druze lunch and hospitality. Later we drive along the Mediterranean Sea to Caesarea, Roman capital of Judea. Here we view the beautifully restored theatre and the ruins of the ancient town, its harbour and aqueduct. We arrive in Tel Aviv, considered to the financial centre and the technology hub of Israel. This evening we have an included dinner.
Accommodation: Prima City Tel Aviv or similar

01.03.18 Tel Aviv

(B/D)

Today we have a full day tour of Tel Aviv. First we tour Old Jaffa and stroll through the artists colony and the ancient port. See the home of Simon the Tanner. Then we explore the origins of Tel Aviv as the first Hebrew city on a guided walk through Ahuzat Bayit, the first neighbourhood, Rothschild Boulevard and the 'White City', the UNESCO World Heritage collection of Bauhaus architecture. We tour the interactive Palmach Museum to experience the trials and triumphs of the pre-state elite fighting unit in their struggle to help create the State of Israel.
Accommodation: Prima City Tel Aviv or similar

02.03.18 Tel Aviv - Jerusalem

(B/D)

After breakfast we depart Tel Aviv, and travel to Rehovot. Discover the roots of Israeli ingenuity at the Ayalon institute in Rehovot, a clandestine munitions factory operated by the Haganah, before the establishment of the State of Israel. We continue via the Valley of Elah and learn about the Biblical story of David and Goliath. Our next visit will be to the renowned Israel Museum, recently renovated and enhanced, including the Second Temple Model and the Shrine of the Book, where the Dead Sea Scrolls are housed. On the way to our hotel we drive by the Supreme Courthouse and the Knesset, which is the Israeli parliament. Check into our hotel for a four night stay. Dinner this evening is included.

Accommodation: Prima Royal Jerusalem or similar

03.03.18 Jerusalem

(B/D)

This morning we enter the Old City via Lion Gate to walk along the Via Dolorosa. We visit Pool of Bethesda, St. Anne Byzantine and Crusader Church. Walk along the Stations of the Cross, through narrow alleys and authentic bazaars to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. We continue to the Garden Tomb, which is believed to be the garden and sepulchre of Joseph of Arimathea and therefore a possible site of the resurrection of Jesus.

From atop the Mount of Olives, we can see the churches, mosques and synagogues of the three major religions which claim Jerusalem as their spiritual centre. We end the day with a visit to the Garden of Gethsemane, before returning to our hotel for dinner.

Accommodation: Prima Royal Jerusalem or similar

04.03.18 Jerusalem

(B/D)

After breakfast this morning we visit Mount Zion, with the site of the Upper Room of the Last Supper, King David's Tomb and House of Caiaphas, where Jesus was held. We return to Jerusalem and visit the Jewish Quarter, the Ancient Cardo Maximo and the newly restored Hurva Synagogue.

We again enter the Old City, via Dung Gate to see the Southern Steps, the archaeological reconstruction of the Temple Steps, where Jesus walked, and also visit the Davidson Centre, which is located in the ruins of an 8th century Islamic palace, at the foot of the Temple Mount. We view the Temple Mount and see the Western Wall, the most sacred site for the Jewish people. Walk along Rabbis Tunnels and come as close as possible to the Holy of Holies.

Dinner this evening is included.

Accommodation: Prima Royal Jerusalem or similar

05.03.18 Jerusalem

(B/D)

Today we visit Yad VaShem Museum, the memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. Hear the stories of those who made the ultimate sacrifice for the State of Israel, at the Mount Herzl Military Cemetery, including the Leaders of the Nation section.

Later we experience the hustle and bustle of daily life in Jerusalem at the vibrant Machaneh Yehudah Open Air Market, known by locals as 'the shuk'. There is some free time for last minute shopping in Jerusalem. This evening we enjoy an included dinner.

Accommodation: Prima Royal Jerusalem or similar

06.03.18 Jerusalem – Amman, Jordan - Dubai

(B) This morning we check out of the hotel and travel to the Allenby Border crossing between Israel and Jordan. Upon arrival on the Jordan side, our guide will assist with formalities and then transfer us to Amman for a panoramic sightseeing tour of the old and modern parts of the city, or some free time for shopping. Following this we are transferred to Amman airport for our flight to Dubai. All passengers depart Amman at 4.55pm on EK 904, arriving in Dubai at 9.45pm. Upon arrival in Dubai, we are met and transferred to our hotel for a two night stay. Accommodation: Arabian Courtyard Hotel & Spa

07.03.18 Dubai

(B) This morning we have a city sightseeing tour of Dubai. Sample the historic sites and vibrant cosmopolitan life of Dubai on this comprehensive tour. The tour starts with a photo stop at the iconic landmark of Dubai, Burj Al Arab, which is a luxury hotel standing on an artificial island. The shape of the building is designed to mimic the sail of a ship. Proceed to Jumeirah, the picturesque palace and residential area of Dubai, which is also home to the impressive Jumeirah Mosque. The tour continues to Al Bastakiya, the old part of Dubai, to reach the museum located in Al Fahidi Fort. Afterwards we board the Abra (water taxi) to cross the creek to the spice souk. On our return there is time to shop in the most famous market of Dubai, the gold souk. The souk consists of over 300 retailers that trade almost exclusively in jewellery. By some estimates, approximately 10 tons of gold are present at any given time in the souk. The remainder of the day is at leisure. Accommodation: Arabian Courtyard Hotel & Spa

08.03.18 Dubai – Australia

(B) This morning we transfer to Dubai airport for our flights home. Perth passengers depart Dubai at 9.15am on EK 424, arriving in Perth at 00.05am the next morning (09.03.18). Melbourne passengers depart Dubai at 10.10am on EK 406, arriving in Melbourne at 6.30am the next morning (09.03.18). Sydney passengers depart Dubai at 10.15am on EK 412, arriving in Sydney at 7.00am the next morning (09.03.18). Brisbane passengers depart Dubai at 10.25am on EK 434, arriving in Brisbane at 6.40am the next morning (09.03.18).

This tour rating typically involves a good level of physical activity, such as ascending stairs, getting into a bathtub shower, being responsible for your own luggage at airports and hotels, boarding trains quickly with your luggage, walking distances of up to 500 metres at a time over possible uneven ground and/or cobblestone streets. Deposits and Payments: A non-refundable deposit of \$400 per person is payable within 7 days of booking. This deposit is not refundable should you later cancel. The balance is payable 10 weeks prior to departure.

Refunds and Cancellations: Cancellations after final payment will result in a refund limited to whatever we can recoup from the airline.

Airline Tickets - Please note that any changes made to airline tickets once they have been issued will likely incur high cancellation and/or reissue fees. These fees are typically set by the airline and are outside of our control.

Insurance: Adequate travel insurance is essential. We can arrange this for you if desired. Macleay Valley Travel offers Suresave Travel Insurance. Until this time the travel insurance cannot be processed and will not be valid. Macleay Valley Travel will bare no responsibility for any consequences that may occur as a result of an incomplete insurance application.

Passports: All travellers require a current passport with at least 6 months left on it at the end of the tour. Non-Australian passport holders require a re-entry visa for Australia. Australian passport holders require a visa on arrival for Jordan. This visa cost is included in the tour price. No other visas are required for this tour if you are travelling on an Australian passport.

Basic Tour Price and Taxes: Air taxes and fuel levies are included in the basic tour price if the tour is paid in full on or before the due date on the final invoice. Macleay Valley Travel reserves the right to charge for any increase in air taxes and fuel levies if the tour is not paid in full by the due date.

Not Included in the Cost: All items of a personal nature such as telephone calls, drinks, excess baggage, tips, meals, (except those specified in the itinerary), etc. Also travel insurance.
