Arrive Cornwall at 7am, ship departs at 6pm.

Cornwall is a county on England's rugged southwestern tip. It forms a peninsula encompassing wild moorland and hundreds of sandy beaches, culminating at the promontory Land's End. Your port of call today is known for its deep natural harbour on the Fal Estuary, and beaches like Swanpool and Gyllyngvase. The National Maritime Museum Cornwall has interactive galleries and a flotilla of model boats. On Pendennis Point, Pendennis Castle is a well-preserved 16th-century fortress built by Henry VIII.

Arrive Cork at 7am, ship departs at 5pm.

Cork is the second largest city in the Republic of Ireland and the third largest on the island of Ireland. The city centre is an island between two channels of the River Lee which meet downstream at its eastern end, where the quays and docks along the river lead outwards towards Lough Mahon and Cork Harbour, one of the largest natural harbours in the world.

Originally a monastic settlement, Cork was expanded by Viking invaders around 915. Cork city was once fully walled, and the remnants of the old medieval town centre can be found around South and North Main streets.

22.08.25 **Qaqortoq, Greenland**

Arrive Qaqortoq at 8am, ship departs at 6pm.

Qaqortoq is a town in southern Greenland, set within a system of fjords. It has a population of just under 3000 people and is the logistics and commercial hub of South Greenland. The town centre is home to 18th century colonial buildings and a landmark fountain. Qaqortoq Museum features displays about Greenlandic culture. From Lake Tasersuaq, trails lead through rugged mountains to the old Norse settlement of Igaliku. To the southeast, the hot springs at Uunartoq sit beside a bay dotted with icebergs.

23.08.25 **Nanortalik, Greenland**

Arrive Nanortalik at 7am, ship departs at 6pm.

With 1,185 inhabitants as of 2020, it is the eleventh-largest town in the country. The name *Nanortalik* means ‘Place of Polar Bears’ or ‘Place Where the Polar Bears Go’ (from Greenlandic: *nanooq*). Because of its location, this area was one of the first parts of Greenland settled by the Norse and one of the last settled by the Inuit. The town was founded in 1770 as Nennortalik. In 1797, a permanent trading depot was set up in Nanortalik by traders from Julianehåb. Due to poor harbour facilities, the town was moved three kilometres northward in 1830, where it remains today. Of the old town, only some scattered ruins remain.

Arrive Akureyri at 9am, ship departs at 6pm.

Akureyri, ‘The Capital of the North’ is a town in the fjord Eyjafjörður in North Iceland. It lies just 100 kilometres away from the Arctic Circle. It is Iceland’s second-largest urban area with a population of about 19,500. It is large enough to offer a rich selection of entertainment, art and culture, yet small enough to be very personal and close to nature. It’s easy to be fascinated by Akureyri with its brightly painted wooden houses, cosy bars and steep streets leading down from the hills into the friendly city centre. Even the traffic lights are cute, with stop lights in the shape of red hearts.

27.08.25 **Isafjordur, Iceland**

Arrive Isafjordur at 8am, ship departs at 6pm.

Isafjordur is a town in the Westfjords region of northwest Iceland. It’s known for its dramatic landscapes and is located on the Skutulsfjordur fjord, part of the larger Isafjardardjup fjord. The settlement is one of the few large enough in the Icelandic Westfjords to be considered a town. It is surrounded by mountains and the

sea, creating a stunning landscape that attracts visitors worldwide.

The town became an important trading and fishing centre during the 16th century thanks to its coastal location and natural harbour. Seafood still makes up a large part of the local diet, and one of the best seafood restaurants in Iceland is located here.

Isafjordur's Old Town is a well-preserved area of historic buildings dating back to the 18th century. These brightly coloured buildings were once used as trading posts, homes, and warehouses, but they now give visitors a glimpse into the town's past and make it a very picturesque place for a stroll.

28.08.25 Reykjavik, Iceland

(B/L/D) Arrive Reykjavik at 7am, ship departs at 6pm.

Reykjavik, on the coast of Iceland, is the country's capital and largest city. The capital area has about 60% of Iceland's population. It's home to the National and Saga museums, tracing Iceland's Viking history. The striking concrete Hallgrimskirkja Church and rotating Perlan glass dome offer sweeping views of the sea and nearby hills. Exemplifying the island's volcanic activity is the geothermal Blue Lagoon spa, near the village of Grindavik.

Deposits and Payments - A non-refundable deposit of \$1250 per person is payable within 3 days of booking, based on an inside cabin for the cruise. This deposit is not refundable or transferrable should you later cancel. The balance is payable in full 14 weeks prior to departure. Macleay Valley Travel has to adhere to strict payment deadlines and your booking on the tour may be cancelled if final payment is not received by the due date, with no refund applicable. Please note that if you wish to upgrade to an ocean view or balcony cabin, the non-refundable deposit amount will increase to \$1,500 per person, or possibly more depending on availability.

Refunds and Cancellations - Cancellations after final payment will result in a refund limited to whatever we can recoup from the airline. Any refund for a cancelled booking will not be paid until the airline provides the refund to Macleay Valley Travel.

Airline Tickets - Please note that any changes made to airline tickets once they have been issued will likely incur high cancellation and/or reissue fees. These fees are typically set by the airline and are outside of our control.

Insurance - Adequate travel insurance that includes medical coverage for Covid-19 is strongly recommended. Please contact your travel insurance provider. The responsibility to obtain adequate travel insurance rests with the passenger.

Passports - All travellers require a current passport with at least 6 months left on it at the end of the tour. Some Non-Australian passport holders require a re-entry visa for Australia. From early 2025, Australian citizens travelling to the EU will require an ETIAS (European Travel Information and Authorisation System) for stays of up to 90 days. This is otherwise known as a European visa waiver. The expected cost for this is 7 Euros per person. Similarly, the UK Government is expected to bring in a British visa waiver in 2025. The expected cost is approximately 10 GBP per person. More details will be advised before departure. No other visas are required if you are travelling on an Australian passport.

Basic Tour Price and Taxes - Air taxes and fuel levies are included in the travel price if the package is paid in full on or before the due date on the final invoice.

Not Included in the Cost - All items of a personal nature such as telephone calls, drinks, excess baggage, tips, meals, (except those specified in the itinerary), etc. Also travel insurance and departure taxes. Credit card payments (Visa/MasterCard) can only be accepted if 1.2% is added to the price for Visa/MasterCard and 2% for American Express.

Princess Onboard Gratuities / Crew Appreciation - The 'Crew Appreciation' is a daily amount for each guest that will be automatically added to your onboard account to recognize the efforts of a wide variety of crewmembers who contribute to the experiences of all our guests.
