11.10.25 Australia - Dubai

Depart Brisbane at 9.00pm on EK 435, arriving in Dubai at 5.10am the next morning (12.10.25).

Depart Sydney at 9.45pm on EK 413, arriving in Dubai at 5.15am the next morning (12.10.25).

Depart Melbourne at 10.15pm on EK 407, arriving in Dubai at 5.15am the next morning (12.10.25).

12.10.25 Dubai – Madrid, Spain

All passengers depart Dubai at 7.40am on EK 141, arriving in Madrid at 1.25pm.

Upon arrival we are transferred to the hotel for a two night stay.

The remainder of the day is at leisure to recover from your flights.

Accommodation: Melia Castilla or similar

13.10.25 Madrid

(B/D)

This morning we have a panoramic city tour of Madrid. See the medieval origins of the city, like the Arabic fortress at the Barrio de la Moreria, famous for its historical buildings, such as the Royal Palace. Then we head to Cibeles and Neptuno Fountains and the Puerta de Alcala. Admire the 19th century works such as the Prado Museum. The contemporary Madrid with areas such as Gran Via, Castellana, the district of Salamanca, Plaza Castilla and Parque del Oeste. Also see the commercial and financial areas of modern Madrid, the emblematic Las Ventas Bullring and the Santiago Bernabeu Football Stadium.

This evening we have an included Tapas Tour. We will visit several typical Madrid establishments and taste the most classical tapas of the capital. Taverns full of flavour and history, a living memory of traditional Madrid. In each of them we will try some of its most characteristic tapas, accompanied by local wines.

Accommodation: Melia Castilla or similar

14.10.25 Madrid – Salamanca - Porto

(B)

After breakfast we depart Madrid for Salamanca. Enjoy free time in this university city with its vibrant community made up of various nationalities. The city was founded in the 1100's and is known for its ornate sandstone architecture. Later we continue to the Portuguese border and travel to Porto. On arrival we check into the hotel for a two night stay.

Accommodation: Yotel Porto or similar

15.10.25 Porto

(B)

We begin today with a panoramic sightseeing tour of Porto, known for its stately bridges and production of port wine. We admire the cathedral, stock exchange building and Santa Clara Church. Afterwards we enjoy a cruise of the Douro River aboard the Blue Boats cruise and discover the historic heritage of the area, including a visit to a well-known port wine cellar with an included wine tasting.

The remainder of the day is at leisure to explore Porto at your own pace.

Accommodation: Yotel Porto or similar

16.10.25 Porto – Coimbra

(B) This morning we depart Porto for Coimbra, which is a riverfront city in central Portugal. The city is the seat of one of the oldest universities in Europe and the birthplace of Fado. We have an overnight stay in Coimbra.
Accommodation: Hotel Vila Gale Coimbra or similar

17.10.25 Coimbra – Batalha – Nazare – Alcobaca – Obidos - Lisbon

(B/D) Today we set off for Lisbon. Our first stop is at the Batalha Monastery, which is one of the most beautiful examples of Portuguese and European architecture. It was erected in commemoration of the 1385 Battle of Aljubarrota and serves as the burial church of the 15th century Aviz dynasty of Portuguese royalty. Please note that entrance to the monastery is not included, due to time constraints. Next we visit the picturesque fishing town of Nazaré and enjoy some free time before continuing to Alcobaca, known for its World Heritage Gothic style monastery. Our next stop is the fortified town of Obidos, located on a hilltop and known as the wedding present town. Upon arrival in Lisbon, we check into the hotel for a two night stay. This evening we enjoy an included traditional dinner and Fado show, a music style which can be traced back to Lisbon in the 1820's.
Accommodation: Sana Malhoa or similar

18.10.25 Lisbon - Sintra - Lisbon

(B) Lisbon is the stunning capital city of Portugal, known in Roman times as Olisipo. On our morning sightseeing tour, we drive through the city's main squares and avenues. We see Belem Tower, Jeronimos Monastery, Coach Museum, Monument to the Discoverers, Marquis of Pombal Square and Liberty Avenue. In the afternoon we travel to the romantic town of Sintra. We have an outside visit to the Royal Palace on our walking tour. Then we travel to Cabo de Roca, the easternmost point of the European continent to enjoy impressive views of the Atlantic Ocean. Afterwards we return to our hotel in Lisbon through the coastal town of Cascais and the cosmopolitan city of Estoril, known for its famous casino (the largest in Europe).
Accommodation: Sana Malhoa or similar

19.10.25 Lisbon – Caceres - Cordoba

(B) This morning we depart Lisbon and travel back into Spain. We visit the World Heritage Old Town of Caceres, an urban ensemble of 9 hectares surrounded by a wall of 1,174 metres. The city's history of battles between Moors and Christians is reflected in the architecture, which is a blend of Roman, Islamic, Northern Gothic and Italian Renaissance styles. We have time to walk through its Plaza Mayor and the Old Town with its famous Medieval Quarter. Afterwards we continue to Cordoba for an overnight stay.
Accommodation: Hesperia Cordoba or similar

20.10.25 Cordoba - Seville

(B) Cordoba is a city located in the southern region of Andalusia. The city is home to one of the world's greatest Islamic buildings, the Mezquita, a symbol of the worldly, sophisticated culture that flourished here more than a millennium ago when Cordoba

was capital of Islamic Spain and western Europe's biggest, most cultured city. We tour this impressive mosque and stroll through the narrow winding streets of the Jewish Quarter. In the afternoon we travel two hours to Seville for a two night stay.
Accommodation: Hesperia Sevilla or similar

21.10.25 Seville

(B) Seville is the largest city in southern Spain. Greek legend has it that the city was built by Hercules himself, on six stone columns. However archaeology points to an early Bronze Age settlement around 1,000-1,100 B.C.
Our morning panoramic city tour includes an inside visit to the cathedral, the second largest in the catholic world after St. Peters in Rome. We see the Santa Cruz Quarter which is the former Jewish Quarter of Seville, the Maria Luisa Park and the incredible Plaza de Espana, which is known as the 'Venice of Seville'.
The afternoon is at leisure for you to take in the flavours of this active city.
Accommodation: Hesperia Sevilla or similar

22.10.25 Seville – Granada

(B/D) After breakfast we depart Seville for Granada, which was the last stronghold of the Moorish Kingdoms until 1492. We visit the Alhambra and Generalife Gardens in the company of a local guide. The Alhambra is the main jewel of this beautiful city. During our visit to the Alhambra Palace and the surrounding group of small palaces, gardens, patios and towers, it becomes clear to us why King Boabdil cried when Granada was reconquered by the catholic monarchs. An outstanding feature is the Gardens of Generalife, which was the summer residence for the king. The area is a beautiful combination of water springs, gardens and architecture.
Please note that the visit to the Alhambra is subject to the availability and confirmation of the Alhambra authority.
This evening we have an included traditional dinner and flamenco show in Granada.
Accommodation: Melia Granada or similar

23.10.25 Granada - Valencia

(B/D) We depart Granada for Valencia. Travelling via Murcia, capital of the fertile garden of the Segura River. We continue north via Alicante, the second largest city within the region of Valencia. Valencia is one of the main capitals of the Mediterranean Coast and home to the well renowned and delicious 'Paella'.
At the end of the 19th century the city of Valencia experienced an important political and social development, which was reflected in the architecture of the city. On our tour we will see the Paseo de la Alameda, the Ensanche with significant buildings such as the Casa Chapa. We continue to the neighbourhood of Colon and commence a walking tour to discover the eclectic and original parts of the city, such as the Casa de los Dragones and its commercial area, the Plaza del Patriarca and the Palace of the Marquis de dos Aguas. Our tour will end at a local restaurant where we enjoy the original and authentic Valencia Paella. The menu consists of starters, Valencian paella, dessert, coffee and a drink.
Accommodation: NH Valencia Las Artes or similar

24.10.25 Valencia – Barcelona

(B) Our morning city tour of this bright city includes a drive past the old riverbed of the Turia to the modern 'City of Arts and Sciences' architectural complex, to see the

impressive exteriors of the six buildings. In the early afternoon we depart north along the Mediterranean coast to Catalunya, via Tarragona, the Roman Tarraco. We arrive in Barcelona and check into the hotel for a two night stay.
Accommodation: Catalonia Barcelona Plaza or similar

25.10.25 Barcelona

(B/D)

Our morning city tour of Barcelona includes a drive along the main avenues with impressive modern buildings by Gaudí such as La Pedrera and Casa Milá, declared as World Heritage buildings for their impressive designs. We also see the Montjuïc Park with spectacular views of the city, Olympic Ring, Monument to Columbus and the Olympic Port. We also have an included visit to the Sagrada Familia, which is a famous Roman Catholic Basilica heavily influenced by the Chief Architect Antonio Gaudí. The basilica is considered to be Gaudí's masterpiece. Construction began in 1882 and after 140 years it is still unfinished. It is one of Barcelona's most famous landmarks. Please note that tickets to this event are subject to availability. Every effort will be made to secure these tickets in advance, but with visitor restrictions and capped ticket sales, it cannot be guaranteed.

The remainder of the afternoon is free for you to further discover this vibrant city.

This evening enjoy an included farewell Tapas dinner at a local restaurant.

Accommodation: Catalonia Barcelona Plaza or similar

26.10.25 Barcelona - Dubai

(B)

This morning is at leisure. We have a 4pm late checkout from our hotel. After that we can store our luggage at the hotel reception until our late afternoon transfer to the airport for our flights home.

Depart Barcelona at 8.25pm on EK 188, arriving in Dubai at 5.55am the next morning (27.10.25).

27.10.25 Dubai – Australia

Sydney passengers depart Dubai at 10.15am on EK 412, arriving in Sydney at 7.00am the next morning (28.10.25).

Melbourne passengers depart Dubai at 10.00am on EK 406, arriving in Melbourne at 6.25am the next morning (28.10.25).

Brisbane passengers depart Dubai at 10.25am on EK 434, arriving in Brisbane at 6.30am the next morning (28.10.25).

Tour Difficulty Level 3

This tour rating typically involves a good level of physical activity, such as ascending stairs, getting into a bathtub shower, being responsible for your own luggage at airports and hotels, walking distances of approximately 500 metres and over at a time, over possible uneven ground and/or cobblestone streets. Walking tours of considerable distances should be expected on tours with this rating as well as some early departures.



Itinerary for Morocco Extension

26.10.25 Barcelona – Casablanca, Morocco

(B) After breakfast we are transferred to the airport for our flight to Morocco. Depart Barcelona at 12.45pm on Royal Air Maroc flight AT 965, arriving in Casablanca at 2.55pm. We are transferred to our hotel in Casablanca for a two night stay. The remainder of the day is at leisure.
Accommodation: Hotel Odyssee Centre or Hotel Club Val D'Anfa or similar

27.10.25 Casablanca

(B) Today is at leisure in the port city of Casablanca, which is the commercial hub of Western Morocco. The city's French colonial legacy is seen in its downtown Mauresque architecture, a blend of Moorish style and European art deco. Standing partly over the water, the enormous Hassan II Mosque, completed in 1993, has a 210m minaret topped with lasers directed toward Mecca. In your free time you may wish to visit Rick's Café, a bar/restaurant built in 2004 to recreate the famous Humphrey Bogart bar from the 1942 movie, 'Casablanca'.
Accommodation: Hotel Odyssee Centre or Hotel Club Val D'Anfa or similar

28.10.25 Casablanca – Marrakech

(B/D) This morning we drive to Marrakech to meet the rest of the group before embarking on a guided city tour of Marrakech. Inside the rose coloured medina walls is a tangle of winding streets and alleys that open onto verdant gardens and bustling souks. At the heart of the medina is Djemaa El Fna, the city's exuberant market place and towering over it is the famous Koutoubia Mosque, the tallest building in the city.
Accommodation: Adam Park Hotel & Spa or similar

29.10.25 Marrakech - Ait Benhaddou - Ouarzazate

(B/L/D) Departing the city this morning we travel across the plains of Al Haouz and reach the great High Atlas mountains. Climbing over the pass of Tizi n Tichka, we stop for lunch and then continue onwards with great views over the mountains and valleys to Ait Benhaddou. This incredible ancient fortified kasbah was built for defence purposes high on a hill and is a stunningly well preserved medieval city which has famously featured in many blockbuster movies, including Gladiator and Laurence of Arabia. Its beauty is unequalled with any other fortified kasbah in south Morocco. Carrying on we continue south to the Hollywood of North Africa, Ouarzazate. Ouarzazate is famous for being the filming location for many other Hollywood blockbusters and famous TV shows including James Bond – the Living Daylights, The Mummy and more recently Game of Thrones.
Accommodation: Ksar Ben Youssef or Dar Amoudou or similar

30.10.25 Ouarzazate – Todra Gorge – Merzouga

(B/L/D) This morning we begin our journey into the Sahara with a medley of palm trees, rose fields and magnificent gorges. Travelling from Ouarzazate, there is a possibility of visiting the kasbah Amherdhil in Skoura before seeing the rose fields and reaching scenic Todra Gorge. Surrounded by towering vertical limestone cliffs reaching heights of 1,000 ft, it is known as Morocco's Grand Canyon. The charm of Todra

lies in its changing colours as the sun slowly moves from east to west. There is time to wander through Todra before we hit the road again for Merzouga – our base before we head into the Sahara. Depending on the time of year, spend the afternoon relaxing and swimming before climbing aboard our camels for an incredible trek into the Sahara Desert to watch a beautiful sunset and spend the night at our remote Berber Camp, nestled amongst the dunes of Erg Chebbi. We enjoy local food, music and an amazing night camping in the Sahara. If you would prefer to take a jeep to the Berber camp, this can be arranged locally through your guide at no additional cost. Accommodation: Touareg Berber Camp or similar

31.10.25 Merzouga (Sahara) - Fes

(B/L) Departing early, we climb back on our camels disembarking for a truly stunning sunrise. After freshening up and breakfast in Merzouga we're back on the road heading for Fes. It's a long drive today however there is a lot to see on the way. We'll pass through cedar forests full of Barbary Macaque monkeys on our way through the Moyen Atlas Mountains. Just before Fes we stop at Ifrane – a beautiful town often likened to a Swiss Alpine resort. Along the way we also start to see our first glimpse of Morocco's nomadic Berbers – travelling across the mountains and often staying in make shift tents as they head to their next destination. We arrive into Fes in the early evening.

Accommodation: Hotel Atlas Saiss or similar

01.11.25 Fes

(B) Fes is the oldest and largest medieval city in the world and its medina is a cacophony of aromas, sights and sounds. This morning we enjoy a guided tour of Fes el Bali - the old walled city. This fascinating medina is a veritable rabbit warren of 9,400 alleys that often finish with dead ends – so be sure to stay close to the group! We also visit the dye-pits and tanneries before lunch in the medina. The remainder of the day is at leisure – why not take part in an optional Tagine Making Class or a night of Moroccan entertainment and food at a restaurant in town (both payable locally).

Accommodation: Hotel Atlas Saiss or similar

02.11.25 Fes – Volubilis – Meknes – Rabat

(B) Departing Fes this morning we visit the fascinating UNESCO listed Roman ruins of Volubilis, which date back to AD40. Continuing on, we stop at the Imperial City of Meknes, which became known as the Versailles of Morocco due to its impressive buildings and elaborate monuments. After some free time our final stop of the day is Rabat, Morocco's capital.

Accommodation: Riad Dar Alia or Riad Dar Zouhour or similar

03.11.25 Rabat – Casablanca

(B) This morning we take a guided tour of Rabat and visit some of the capital's highlights, including the impressive Chellah - a necropolis and complex of ancient, medieval ruins, the Royal Palace and the Mausoleum of Mohammed V. After lunch we continue to Casablanca where we visit the Hassan II Mosque, which has the tallest minaret and is the third largest mosque in the world - it can hold 25,000 worshippers at any one time. After our visit to the mosque we say goodbye to our fellow passengers continuing on to Marrakech and check in to our hotel in Casablanca.

Accommodation: Hotel Odyssee Centre or Hotel Club Val D'Anfa or similar

04.11.25 Casablanca - Dubai

(B) Our amazing tour of Morocco ends today after hotel check out. We are transferred to the airport for our flights home. Depart Casablanca at 3.05pm on EK 752, arriving in Dubai at 01.30am the next morning (05.11.25).

05.11.25 Dubai – Australia

Brisbane passengers depart Dubai at 02.50am on EK 430, arriving in Brisbane at 10.40pm the same day.

Melbourne passengers depart Dubai at 02.55am on EK 408, arriving in Melbourne at 11.20pm the same day.

Sydney passengers will have the use of accommodation located near the airport until their next flight. Sydney passengers depart Dubai at 10.15am on EK 412, arriving in Sydney at 07.00am the next morning (06.11.25).

Note: The price for the Morocco extension is currently \$2,575 per person twin share or \$3,175 single room. Please note that this extension is not exclusive to Macleay Valley Travel customers and other English speaking passengers will be on the tour while in Morocco, up to a maximum of 24 passengers. The accommodation standard and tour comfort in Morocco is generally less than the standard you would expect in Spain & Portugal. Conditions for Macleay Valley Travel's Spain & Portugal Tour

Deposits and Payments - A non-refundable deposit of \$400 per person is payable within 7 days of booking. This deposit is not refundable should you later cancel. If you are doing the Morocco extension there is an additional non-refundable deposit of \$700 required. The balance is payable in full 10 weeks prior to departure. Macleay Valley Travel has to adhere to strict payment dates and your booking may be cancelled if final payment is not received by the due date, with no refund applicable.

Refunds and Cancellations - Cancellations after final payment will result in a refund limited to whatever we can recoup from the airline. Any refund for a cancelled booking will not be paid until the airline provides the refund to Macleay Valley Travel.

Insurance - Adequate travel insurance that includes medical coverage for Covid-19 is required. Please contact your preferred travel insurance provider. The responsibility to obtain adequate travel insurance rests with the passenger. Proof of your travel insurance is required to be presented to us on or before the final payment date of the tour.

Airline Tickets - Please note that any changes made to airline tickets once they have been issued will likely incur high cancellation and/or reissue fees. These fees are typically set by the airline and are outside of our control.

Passports - All travellers require a current passport with at least 6 months left on it at the end of the tour. Non-Australian passport holders require a re-entry visa for Australia. In 2025, Australian citizens travelling to the EU will require an ETIAS (European Travel Information and Authorisation System) for stays of up to 90 days. This is otherwise known as a European visa waiver. The expected cost for this is 7-10 Euros per person, payable by credit card.

Basic Tour Price and Taxes - Air taxes and fuel levies are included in the basic tour price if the tour is paid in full on or before the due date on the final invoice. Macleay Valley Travel reserves the right to charge for any increase in air taxes and fuel levies if the tour is not paid in full by the due date.
